In tribute and memory, the Township of Marlboro dedicated a memorial and, through the efforts of Councilman Jeff Cantor, a US Army Reservist, was able to secure a 12 foot steel "I" beam recovered from the World Trade Center.

We will never forget. The Marlboro Township 9-11 Memorial, located on Municipal

property, visible from Wyncrest Road, was created as a place for solace and as a reminder of those we lost that day. The Memorial is open to all every day, dawn to dusk, and easily accessible from the parking lot at the Recreation Center.

Over time, we maintain and improve this serene setting. Since the initial dedication the Township has added a tranquil fountain, seating, and foliage.
