PREPARED FOR FREEZING TEMPERATURES

Dear Resident,

According to the National Weather Service, the current extremely frigid conditions will last through Saturday with temperatures in the single digits and wind chill temperatures as low as -11 degrees. It is important to limit outside exposure to the extent possible and stay well covered if you must venture outside.

At this time, there are no power outages in Marlboro Township; however, we are in regular contact with JCP&L during this period. Following Superstorm Sandy, the Township applied for and received a grant from FEMA to acquire a full service generator for the Recreation Center. As a result, the Township is prepared to open a warming center with cell phone charging stations in the event of any prolonged outage. Updates will be provided as needed via email and can also be viewed on the Township website, www.marlboro-nj.gov.

It is especially important during times like this to stay informed. Please take this opportunity to register to receive emails and emergency "reverse 911" phone calls. When registering, remember to include your cell phone since many house phones do not work if the power goes out. Go to the Township website www.marlboro-nj.gov and click the blue button on the top right (Communications for Residents).

As a reminder, the Marlboro Township Police Department is open 24/7, and may be reached by dialing 911 for an emergency or the non-emergency number 732-536-0100.
